



Sermon Notes: Christianity at A Crossroads

Introduction: Paul is at a literal crossroads in Corinth; but he's also at a crossroads emotionally and missiologically.

Luke shows us 5 things that guided and encouraged Paul at this crossroads in his personal and ministry life:

1. God's purpose.

2. God's presence.

3. God's promise.

4. God's people.

5. God's providence.



Application Questions: Christianity at A Crossroads

1. What are some potential sources of discouragement or anxiety for those trying to live as countercultural Christians in Denver today? How have these affected you personally?
2. What are some of the major crossroads that many people face at some point in life?
3. What are some relatively minor crossroads that people face on a more regular basis?
4. When you're at a crossroads in your life, what are the main emotions you feel? The main thoughts you have?
5. When you're at a crossroads in your life, what kinds of questions are you trying to answer to help you reach a decision?
6. With respect to question #5, what do these questions reveal about your priorities?
7. What are some purposes God has for your life? Functionally, which of these guide your day-to-day choices? How so?
8. What are some promises of God that relate to your life? Functionally, which of these guide your day-to-day choices? How so?
9. What are some benefits of processing decisions in community with other believers rather than making them alone?
10. With respect to question #9, why don't you do this more?
11. The providence of God is often easier to see in hindsight than in real time. What are some examples of how God has shaped you and given you direction through His providence?
12. What one thing do you need to take away from this message?
