10. In light of God being objectively Most High, how do you make Him ultimate in your affections? Practically, what do you do to give Him the highest place in your calendar, your finances, your priorities, and your plans?
11. As you reflect on God being the Almighty, Everlasting, Most High God, what happens in your heart and mind? How do you want to respond?
12. What one thing do you need to do this week in light of seeing God as Elohim?
