Gospel Applications: A Culture of Our Savior's Mission

Discuss.

1. If you knew it was your last chance to communicate with the people you loved, what would you want to say to them? What would you encourage them to live for?
2. In your own words, how would you summarize the earthly mission of Jesus Christ? What was his ultimate "why"?
3. How does Jesus' mission shape the way you live a typical day?
4. What is your ultimate "why"? (i.e., What's the core motive beneath your actions? If you couldn't do anything else, what's the one thing you feel like you must accomplish?)
5. What would others observe in your daily actions/words that prove #4?
6. What is your default "gospel" that you "preach"? What are you calling other people to put their hope in for some kind of healing/satisfaction/"salvation"?
7. Who knows the Gospel because of you? What resources/methods are you using to reach people with the Good News of Christ?
8. What are you doing for God right now that would utterly, instantly fail were it not for the presence and power of God?
9. How would you like to see God use you to make and mature disciples of Jesus this year? What do you dream of seeing him do through Grace City? What's one step you will take toward this goal right away?

Pray.

1. Confess where you have substituted your own mission for Christ's. Repent of the things God reveals are holding you back from bringing people to him.
2. Envision lost and broken people pouring into the church and coming alive in Christ by the dozens. Ask God to use you to be a part of this life-transforming work.
